Tallmadge is an attractive suburban community situated on the northeastern edge of Akron in Summit County. Summit County reported the population of Tallmadge in July of 2010 at 17,318.

Tallmadge High School is a four-year comprehensive high school. This year there were 884 students in grades 9-12, and a total of 2,585 students in all grades in the district. The first class graduated from Tallmadge High School in 1879 with eight students. Tallmadge High School is accredited by the **North Central Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges** and the <u>Ohio Department of Education</u>.

On Saturday, May 28, 2011, 229 seniors received their diplomas. Ceremonies were held at 2 p.m. at E. J. Thomas Hall on the University of Akron campus.

The School day consists of 4 blocks each semester, 83 minutes in length. Each class meets five days per week with laboratory experience offered within. The Academy block offers teacher office-hours and activities.

Beginning with the 2000 school year, a minimum of 26 credits are required for graduation.

Our minimum requirements include: 4 English, 4 Social Studies, 3 Math, 3 Science, Health/PE and a specified elective.

The recommended college preparatory curriculum includes: 4 English, 3 Math (through Alg. 2), 3 Social Studies, 3 Science, 2 Foreign Language, 1 Visual or Performing Art.

The high school library/media center houses over 14,000 print and audiovisual items, an automated card catalog and 50 computers with various programs and online search capabilities. The librarian presents research skills to various classes.

We offer specific learning disabilities support, cognitive disability and emotional disability programs at Tallmadge High School. Tutoring is available for academic intervention.

The 70 members of the Tallmadge Blue Devil Marching Band performed their Marching Band: competition show titled "Piano Man: The Music of Billy Joel. The band performed at all football games as well as the Kent Roosevelt Premier of Bands, THS Marching Concert and Awards and the Veteran's Day Ceremony. The band was rated Excellent at The University of Akron Competition placing 4th. The band earned Superior Rating at the Nordonia Competition and placed 1st in class, Superior at Revere Competition and placed 1st in class and Grand Champion of show and Superior Rating New Philadelphia and 4th in class. This marked the bands 7th consecutive trip to the state marching band competition. Completing the marching season was a Superior Rated performance at the State Competition on November 6th. The band also performed its annual winter concert in January.

Concert Band: The 48 member concert band continued to perform it's annual March Concert with the HS Choir band and the Spring Pops Concert . John Philip Sousa winner was Greg Lenzo, The U. S. Marine Corps Seper Fidelis winner was Hannah Kenny and the Patrick Gilmore Band Award to Audrey Crawford and Dylan King. The concert band was invited to perform at Kent State University In March and in January 2012 will perform at the Northeast Ohio Concert Band Invitational at Severance Hall, home of the Cleveland Orchestra

Jazz Band: The 23 member jazz ensemble performed at all THS concerts along with appearances at American Cancer Society Relay for Life in Tallmadge, Tallmadge Chamber of Commerce and Tallmadge Middle School. The Louis Armstrong Outstanding Jazz Performer Award winner was Greg Lenzo and Woody Herman Jazz Award was presented to Adam Steurer. The band competed at the Hoover Jazz Festival, placing 3rd. Senior *Greg Lenzo* was named Outstanding Brass Soloist of the event.

Vocal Music: The Choir continued to perform a variety of music this year from Sacred to Spiritual, Broadway to Pop and Movie themes. Performances included Tallmadge Historical Society's Santa On the Circle and Tree Lighting, Tallmadge Prime Timers in Hartville, along with the THS Holiday Concert, Combined Band and Choir Concert and Spring Choral Spectacular with the Show Choir. The Concert Choir also earned an Excellent Rating and 2nd place at the Music In The Parks Festival-Kennywood.

The Tallmadge Show Choir, "Vocal Motion" was directed by Ms. Gallagher and choreographed by Danielle Shook. The group performed at Kent Ridge Retirement Center, Munroe Elementary and the Spring Choir Spectacular. The Show Choir also earned an Excellent Rating and 1nd place at the Music In The Parks Festival at Kennywood.

Drama Productions: Productions of 2010-2011 were The Wizzard of Oz.

Academic Challenge Team: The 42 member team earned a season record 4-12. We were on WEWS TV Academic Challenge Program.
