Tallmadge is an attractive suburban community situated on the northeastern edge of Akron in Summit County. The U.S. Census Bureau reported the population of Tallmadge in 2010 at 17,537.

Tallmadge High School is a four-year comprehensive high school. This year there were 834 students in grades 9-12, and a total of 2,499 students in all grades in the district. The first class graduated from Tallmadge High School in 1879 with eight students. Tallmadge High School is accredited by the **North Central Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges** and the <u>Ohio Department of Education</u>.

On Thursday, May 23, 2013, 194 seniors received their diplomas. Ceremonies were held at 7 p.m. at E. J. Thomas Hall on the University of Akron campus.

The School day consists of 4 blocks each semester, 83 minutes in length. Each class meets five days per week with laboratory experience offered within. The Academy block offers teacher office-hours and activities.

Beginning with the 2000 school year, a minimum of 26 credits are required for graduation.

The Class of 2013 minimum requirements include: 4 English, 4 Social Studies, 3 Math, 3 Science, Health/PE and a specified elective.

The recommended college preparatory curriculum includes: 4 English, 3 Math (through Alg. 2), 3 Social Studies, 3 Science, 2 Foreign Language, 1 Visual or Performing Art.

The high school library/media center houses over 14,000 print and audiovisual items, an automated card catalog and 50 computers with various programs and online search capabilities. The librarian presents research skills to various classes.

We offer specific learning disabilities support, cognitive disability and emotional disability programs at Tallmadge High School. Tutoring is available for academic intervention.

## 2012-2013 Faculty

The Tallmadge High School faculty consists of 60 certified faculty members. 43 hold Masters Degrees (72%) and one is Nationally Board Certified.

Tallmadge High School has been rated Excellent by the Ohio Department of Education for the 8th consecutive year.

*Marching Band:* The 74 members of the Tallmadge Blue Devil Marching Band performed their competition show titled "Music of Rock Legend Steely Dan". The band performed at all football games as well as the Kent Roosevelt Premier of Bands, Medina Band Show, THS Marching Concert and Awards and the Veteran's Day Ceremony. The band was rated Excellent at The Revere HS and at the Nordonia Competition and Superior Rating New Philadelphia and 3<sup>th</sup> in class. This marked the bands 9th consecutive trip to the state marching band competition. Completing the marching season was an Excellent Rated performance at the State Competition on November 3<sup>rd</sup>. The band also performed its annual winter concert in December.

*Concert Band:* The 35 member concert band continued to perform its annual March Concert with the HS Choir band and at the May concert, Graduation and Memorial Day Parade.

*Fine Arts:* T.H.S. students earned one Gold Portfolio, 12 Gold Keys, 11 Silver Keys and 8 Honorable Mention awards at the Regional Scholastic Art Competition. One student was recognized with Honorable Mention at the National Scholastic Art Awards.
