# Profile of the Graduating Class of 2010

Tallmadge is an attractive suburban community situated on the northeastern edge of Akron in Summit County. Summit County reported the population of Tallmadge in July of 2008 at 17,293 residents.

Tallmadge High School is a four-year comprehensive high school. This year there were 868 students in grades 9-12, and a total of 2,576 students in all grades in the district. The first class graduated from Tallmadge High School in 1879 with eight students. Tallmadge High School is accredited by the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges and the Ohio Department of Education.

On Saturday, May 29, 2010, 174 seniors received their diplomas. Ceremonies were held at 2 p.m. at E. J. Thomas Hall on the University of Akron campus.

The School day consists of 4 blocks each semester, 83 minutes in length. Each class meets five days per week with laboratory experience offered within. The Academy block offers teacher office-hours and activities.

Beginning with the 2000 school year, a minimum of 26 credits are required for graduation.

Our minimum requirements include: 4 English, 4 Social Studies, 3 Math, 3 Science, Health/PE and a specified elective.

The recommended college preparatory curriculum includes: 4 English, 3 Math (through Alg. 2), 3 Social Studies, 3 Science, 2 Foreign Language, 1 Visual or Performing Art.

The high school library/media center houses over 14,000 print and audiovisual items, an automated card catalog and 50 computers with various programs and online search capabilities. The librarian presents research skills to various classes.

We offer specific learning disabilities support, cognitive disability and emotional disability programs at Tallmadge High School. Tutoring is available for academic intervention.

Vocal Music: The Choir continued to perform a variety of music this year from Sacred to Spiritual, Broadway to Pop and Movie themes. Performances included Tallmadge Historical Society's Santa On the Circle and Tree Lighting, Tallmadge Prime Timers in Hartville, along with the THS Holiday Concert, Combined Band and Choir Concert and Spring Choral Spectacular with the Show Choir. The Concert Choir also earned an Excellent Rating and 2<sup>nd</sup> place at the Music In The Parks Festival-Kennywood.

The group performed at Kent Ridge Retirement Center, Munroe Elementary and the Spring Choir Spectacular. The Show Choir also earned an Excellent Rating and 1<sup>nd</sup> place at the Music In The Parks Festival at Kennywood.

Drama Productions: Productions of 2009-2010 were The Poe Play, Vlad Dracul, Little Shop of Horrors.

Academic Challenge Team: The 32 member team earned a season record 5-10.
