Profile of the Graduatina Class of 2012

Tallmadge is an attractive suburban community situated on the northeastern edge of Akron in Summit County. The U.S. Census Bureau reported the population of Tallmadge in 2010 at 17,537.

Tallmadge High School is a four-year comprehensive high school. This year there were 834 students in grades 9-12, and a total of 2,499 students in all grades in the district. The first class graduated from Tallmadge High School in 1879 with eight students. Tallmadge High School is accredited by the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges and the Ohio Department of Education.

On Saturday, May 26, 2012, 187 seniors received their diplomas. Ceremonies were held at 2 p.m. at E. J. Thomas Hall on the University of Akron campus.

The School day consists of 4 blocks each semester, 83 minutes in length. Each class meets five days per week with laboratory experience offered within. The Academy block offers teacher office-hours activities.

Beginning with the 2000 school year, a minimum of 26 credits are required for graduation.

The Class of 2012 minimum requirements include: 4 English, 4 Social Studies, 3 Math, 3 Science, Health/PE and a specified elective.

The recommended college preparatory curriculum includes: 4 English, 3 Math (through Alg. 2), 3 Social Studies, 3 Science, 2 Foreign Language, 1 Visual or Performing Art.

The high school library/media center houses over 14,000 print and audioan automated visual items, catalog and 50 computers with various programs online search and capabilities. The librarian presents research skills to various classes.

We offer specific learning disabilities cognitive disability support, emotional disability programs at Tallmadge High School. Tutoring is available for academic intervention.

The Tallmadge High School faculty consists of 57 certified faculty members. 42 hold Masters Degrees (74%) and one is Nationally Board Certified.

Marching Band: The 74 member marching band was rated Excellent at Revere, Superior at Nordonia and Superior and 3rd in class at New Philadelphia. 2011 marked the 8th consecutive trip to the state competition where T.H.S. earned a Superior rating. Members of the Marching and Concert bands also performed at Severance Hall in Cleveland, OH at the *Northeast Ohio Band Invitational* with guest conductor John Boyd.

Fine Arts: T.H.S. students earned 3 Gold Keys, 2 Silver Keys and 3 Honorable Mention awards at the Regional Scholastic Art Competition. Two "Best in Show" and six 1st place awards were earned at the Summit County Schools Art Show and one winner at the state level of the National PTA Reflections Arts Competition.

Drama Productions: Productions of 2011-2012 were Save the World, Seussical The Musical

High School Choir: Competed in the Ohio Music Educators Association's District competition. Performed at the Music Showcase Festivals Competition at Cedar Point, earning the distinction of First Place in their class.

"High Definition" Show Choir: Entered the National Show Choir Competitive circuit. Won a first place runner-up award at the St. Clairsville Show Choir Competition.

ACappella Choir: Competed in the Ohio Music Educators Association's District competition earning a combined 1 rating, the highest given, and one of only eight high school ensembles in the Northeast region to earn the distinction. Performed at the Music Showcase Festivals Competition at Cedar Point earning a First Place distinction and Overall Best Choral Award.
