


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MESSAGE FROM THE Superintendent

About the District

The Tallmadge City School District is located in Tallmadge, a suburban residential community in Summit County, which is in northeastern Ohio. Fourteen square miles of rolling wooded terrain surround the city landmark, Tallmadge Circle - a four-acre park at the center of the community and the hub of its Western Reserve history.

There are three buildings in Tallmadge. Tallmadge Elementary (K-5), Tallmadge Middle School (6-8) and Tallmadge High School (9-12). Tallmadge also has a new athletic complex which now houses the football stadium and track but will eventually add baseball, softball and soccer fields. In conjunction with Tallmadge City, a walking trail will surround the fields.




GRADES 6-8

Athletic Complex

The varsity athletic facilities are finally home where they belong. When Tallmadge High School was completed in 2008, the outdoor athletic facilities remained at the previous site due to lack of funding. This dislocation wasted student time and created safety issues. Additionally, the condition of the athletic facilities was sub-par. The district views these facilities as our "largest classroom" and an investment in these facilities should commensurate with our indoor learning spaces.

Thanks to a supportive community, a \$7.2 million-dollar bond levy was passed in 2016 to build a new stadium, field house, softball field, and practice fields. This project was completed in two phases with the stadium opening in fall 2019 and the softball field and practice fields during the 2021 school year.

The 3,500-seat stadium, named Bagnoli Stadium in the fall of 2023, includes an artificial turf football/soccer field and an 8-lane track. The fieldhouse has locker facilities, public restrooms, and a concession stand. The fields are adjacent to Tallmadge High School allowing students to no longer have to travel off-campus for practices. The new facilities directly benefit the hundreds of students participating in soccer, football, track and field, cross-county, softball, and marching band each year.

The athletic complex benefits both student-athletes and the Tallmadge community as a whole. The Tallmadge Recreation Center adjoins the high school campus. The new athletic facilities have become an extension of the Recreation Center as community members can now complement their exercise by walking the track, running on a cross-country trail, and playing tennis on shared courts. Tallmadge City Schools will continue to work with the city to develop the site as a community hub.













Nutrition & Wellness


BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND WELLNESS COORDINATOR

Erin Pavlic has joined Tallmadge City Schools this year as the TMS and THS Behavioral Health and Wellness Coordinator. She has been serving students and adults in the wellness field for over 5 years, and will be helping establish staff and student wellness initiatives in the Tallmadge City School District. She holds a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology, a Master's Degree in School Psychology, and is an Ohio Certified Prevention Specialist Assistant through the Ohio Chemical Dependency Professionals Board.

With great excitement, we want to share that our district is working towards the establishment of a well rounded Wellness Program that will benefit all staff and students. We know that wellness of students and staff is vital to student success. This is why supporting that wellness is important to our building and district leaders at Tallmadge City Schools

STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SAP)

As part of the Ohio School Wellness Initiative, Ohio's Model Student Assistance Program (SAP) is a school-based framework, designed to provide a variety of services that are focused on prevention of nonacademic barriers to learning. SAP is a comprehensive approach that allows for universal services as well as targeted services and interventions based on student need. Ohio's SAP model provides a continuum of care that incorporates: building awareness, prevention, early identification, evidence-based intervention, referral processes, and guided support services in order to increase students' overall wellbeing and achievement. SAP is a critical part of providing a Multi-tiered System of Support (MTSS) in alignment with the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) tiers of support.




Wellness is a rather expansive domain that can encompass many ambiguous aspects. To provide common language on aspects of wellness, The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA) Developed the 8 Dimensions of Wellness. These dimensions of wellness take into account all the factors that contribute to a person's overall wellness and each domain can affect the overall quality of life

MUTI-TIERED SYSTEM OF SUPPORT (MTSS)

Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) is an integrated framework which addresses academic as well as social-emotional/behavioral development of children in order to meet the needs of all learners. MTSS is a comprehensive approach that allows for universal academic and behavioral instruction as well as targeted interventions based on student need. Academic Response to Intervention (RtI) and Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) are integral parts of MTSS. Assessment, progress monitoring, and data-based decision making are used within this multi-tiered system in order to increase student achievement and behavioral proficiency. MTSS is a fluid process with many variables in order to support learners. Tallmadge City Schools is committed to doing everything possible with the resources we have available to help ALL students succeed.

STUDENT SAFETY

The safety of our students is our number one priority. As such, we have numerous security measures in place: Tallmadge has a comprehensive School Safety Response Plan. The plan is approved by the Ohio Department of Education and Homeland Security. District emergency response is coordinated with the City of Tallmadge Police and Fire Departments. Routine drills help to ensure our staff and students are prepared. Each of our school buildings has a secure entrance. Visitors must be buzzed into the main office and sign in with the secretary. Emergency response radios with instant contact to emergency personnel are present in all buildings. www.safeschoolhelpline.com is a portal for reporting suspicious activity or bullying. Students, parents, and community members use the portal to anonymously email, call, or text information about potential threats to student wellbeing. Officers Dave Quillen and Mike Dornack are our School Resource Officers. Our officers are a constant presence in our schools and a true partner in helping our kids succeed. Additionally, the district partnered with the Tallmadge Police Department to ensure police officers visit all of the school buildings throughout the day.

TALLMADGE WELLNESS COMMITTEE

Tallmadge works to educate our community on healthy living and will promote total fitness by making nutritional food choices, and striving for academic excellence. Teachers, kitchen staff, and community members are focused on ensuring health and wellness are built into the design of our new elementary and middle schools.

NUTRITION

Tallmadge is committed to ensure kids are well- nourished for success by providing complete, healthy choices for breakfast and lunch each school day. The district works with Pisanick Partners for food service supervision and meal planning. Their staff of certified dieticians creates a variety of healthy meal and snack options for our students. Through their menu and nutrition tools, they help teach students how to eat healthy and have fun while doing it! Pisanick Partners is also working with our Wellness Committee to promote health and wellness throughout the Tallmadge community.

STUDENT HEALTH

Tallmadge's school nurses are from Akron Children's Hospital and provide our students with high-quality care. The Tallmadge Athletic Trainers are from Summa Health and help ensure our athletes are safe and successful on the field, court, or mat.

HIGH SCHOOL WELLNESS FAIR

Our students have the opportunity to learn about various topics on mental health and relaxation techniques twice per year, one in the fall, and once in the spring. Our hope is that they can take what they learn and apply it to their lives on daily basis.

TOO GOOD FOR DRUGS PROGRAM

Our counselors and our resource officer work with grades 2 and 5 through a program that educates our students on the impact of drugs. This was the first year that the fifth grade was taught by our some of our model high school students
