2021-2022 Testing Dates

Each school district chooses a consecutive series of school days to administer state tests within specified windows, or periods of time.

Ohio's State Tests in English language arts, mathematics, science and social studies

FALL TEST WINDOWS 2021

- » Grade 3 English language arts Five consecutive school days, including makeups, within the Oct. 18 to Nov.5 window
- » High school end-of-course tests Fifteen consecutive school days, including makeups, within the Nov. 29 to Jan. 14 window

FALL WRITING PILOT TEST WINDOW 2021

The voluntary English language arts writing pilot originally scheduled for fall 2020 has been rescheduled for fall 2021. More information will be available soon.

» English language arts - Nov. 1 - Nov. 19, 2021

SPRING TEST WINDOWS 2022

- School districts select 15 consecutive school days, including makeups, within each test window.
- » English language arts March 14, 2022 April 15, 2022
- » Mathematics, science and social studies March 28, 2022 May 6, 2022

SUMMER TEST WINDOWS 2022 (OPTIONAL)

- » Grade 3 English language arts June 27 July 1, 2022
- » High school end-of-course tests June 27 July 8, 2022

OHIO GRADUATION TESTS

- During the continuous online testing window (September through June), testers have three opportunities to take any part of the OGT still required.
- » Testers requiring paper as an approved accommodation have three test opportunities during the September 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022 test window with staggered start times:
 - Opportunity 1 September 1, 2021 June 30, 2022
 - Opportunity 2 October 18, 2021 June 30, 2022
 - Opportunity 3 November 22, 2021 June 30, 2022

The high-quality student data instrument used must be rigorously reviewed by locally determined experts in the field of education to meet all of the following criteria:

- Align to learning standards
- Measure what is intended to be measured
- Be attributable to the specific teacher for course(s) and grade level(s) taught
- Demonstrate evidence of student learning (achievement and/or growth)
- Follow protocols for administration and scoring
- Provide trustworthy results
- Not offend or be driven by bias

Third Grade Reading Guarantee Promotion Score Update

The State Board of Education has voted to set the promotion score of the grade 3 Ohio's State Test in English Language Arts at 683 for the 2021-2022 school year. Any student who scores 683 or higher on the English language arts scaled score will be eligible for promotion at the end of the year.

In addition, the Ohio Department of Education has set the reading subscore alternative promotion score for the grade 3 English language arts test at 46 for the 2021-2022 school year. Any student who scores 46 or higher on the reading subscore will be eligible for promotion at the end of the year, even if the student scores below 683 on the English language arts test.

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MTSS

Implementation of a Multi-Tiered System of Supports has begun at TES, with tiered intervention supports, progress monitoring tools, quarterly team meetings, and professional development. In addition, the Title I service delivery model has been expanded to meet the intervention needs of our elementary students.

Implementation will be extended to TMS and THS, as we look to maximize Academy Time and work to provide targeted intervention for students based on assessment data and teacher feedback.

Social Emotional Learning

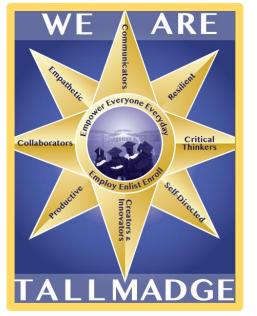
With social isolation and political divisiveness at all-time highs, there has never been a better time to invite empathy into our classrooms and online learning environments. Empathy, or being able to walk in someone else's shoes, engages the distinctively human capacity to step out of ourselves so we can see and experience the world as others do. Note that teaching with empathy does not amount to content-free "fluff". Just the opposite, in fact: Empathy can establish a conceptual lens to help students make meaning of abstract and high-level content. What's more, empathy greatly increases students' personal engagement with the content, which helps make the learning "stick".
