## Profile of the Graduating Class of 2021

Tallmadge is an attractive suburban community situated on the northeastern edge of Akron in Summit County. The U.S. Census Bureau reported the population of Tallmadge in 2020 at 17,519.

Tallmadge High School is a four-year comprehensive high school. This year there were 740 students in grades 9-12, and a total of 2,453 students in all grades in the district. The first class graduated from Tallmadge High School in 1879 with eight students. Tallmadge High School is accredited by the [Ohio Department of Education](http://www.ohio.gov).

On Tuesday, May 18, 2021, 166 seniors received their diplomas. The ceremony was held at 6 p.m. at the Tallmadge High School Stadium.

The school day consists of 4 blocks each semester, 80 minutes in length. For the 20-21 school year, Tallmadge High School operated on a hybrid schedule due to COVID-19 safety protocols. The hybrid schedule occurred with students attending every other day, and students were face-to-face with their teachers 5 times in a 10-day period. Each class worked remotely on the days they were not attending in-person.

Tallmadge High School provided a remote "Tallmadge Online" option for students through an accredited third party, Edgenuity. 23 members of the Class of 2021 attend Tallmadge Online.

A minimum of 26 credits are required for graduation. The Class of 2021 minimum credit requirements include: 4 English, 4 Social Studies, 4 Math, 3 Science, Health/PE, fine art, and financial literacy. The recommended college preparatory curriculum from the State of Ohio includes: 4 English, 4 Math (including Alg.

2), 3 Social Studies, 3 Science, 2 Foreign Language, 1 Visual or Performing Art.

## Grading Scale

The Tallmadge High School grading policy is based on a 4.33 unweighted scale, 4.83 weighted for Honors level courses and a 5.33 weighted scale for AP courses. Tallmadge High School adopted the following grading scale that began for all grades earned during the 2014-15 school year:
